

## Fairfield-Suisun Adult School Childcare Center Parent/Guardian Information (FSASCC)

Childcare is provided for the following blocks of time:

Monday-Friday 8:45 AM – 11:45 AM and/or Monday-Thursday 6:00 PM – 8:30 PM.

Materials fee: \$20 per semester

**PARENT/GUARDIAN MUST REMAIN ON FAIRFIELD-SUISUN ADULT SCHOOL CAMPUS WHILE CHILD(REN) ARE IN THE CARE OF THE CHILDCARE.** Failure to stay on campus and/or in class may result in being asked to leave the Childcare program and a \$10/hour charge for childcare. Failure to attend three (3) consecutive days without notice or three (3) tardiness could be grounds for dismissal.

Parent/Guardian may request changes in date and/or time that child (ren) are cared for at the Child Care Center if said date/time is available. Wait lists will be kept for those parents wanting to enter the program or change dates/times if a block of time is full.

Other Important Information:

- If your child is staying through the lunch hour, please send a healthy lunch and a non-sugary drink.
- A snack will be provided during each 3 ½ hour block. Please let the provider know if your child (ren) have dietary restrictions and/or allergies.
- \* The Child Care Center will follow the same holidays/days off that are observed by the Fairfield Suisun Adult School. Please see the posted calendar for details.
- A change of clothing must be provided for each child at the Child Care Center. In a large ziplock bag with a child's name on it.
- \* Children ages 1-5 will be accepted for daytime program, ages 1-11 nighttime program

### SICKNESS POLICY:

The FSASCC is a "well-childcare facility". At no time do we provide sick childcare. The following illness policies will be strictly enforced, for the health, wellbeing and safety of all concerned.

- Fever: A child needs to be fever free for a minimum of 24 hours before returning to daycare, that means the child is fever free without the aid of Tylenol®, or any other fever reducing substance.
- Fever AND/OR sore throat, rash, vomiting, diarrhea, earache, irritability, or confusion.
- Diarrhea: runny, watery, bloody stools, or 2 or more loose stools within the last 4 hours.

- Vomiting: 2 or more times in a 24-hour period. Note: please do not bring your child if they have vomited in the night.
- Breathing trouble, sore throat, swollen glands, loss of voice, hacking or continuous coughing.
- Runny nose (other than clear), draining eyes or ears.
- Frequent scratching of the body or scalp, lice, rash, or any other spots that resemble childhood diseases, including ringworm.
